

DSP-DARBs

A Program designed to provide qualified dependents of the beneficiaries of the agrarian reform program an opportunity to study and complete agriculture related four (4) year college degree course from the State Universities and Colleges (SUCs) with financial support from DAR.

Qualifications

1. Legitimate dependent of an ARB with combined gross income of not more than P100, 000.00 annually
2. A Senior high school graduate with a general average grade of at least 83%
3. Must have passed the college admission examination given by SUC
4. Must be in good health and of good moral character
5. Must not be convicted of any crime involving moral turpitude;
6. Must not have pending administrative or criminal case; and
7. Must not be a beneficiary of any government scholarship or financial assistance



Target Scholars

Qualified Dependents of ARBs pursuing 4-Year Agri-related courses

The following order of priority is to be followed in the selection of applicants

Status/Degree of Relationship of Applicant w/the Qualified ARB

- 1st Son/Daughter
- 2nd Grandchildren
- 3rd Nephew/Niece
- 4th Applicants Related to their guardians



Scholarship benefits

- ❑ A monthly stipend of Three Thousand Pesos (P3,000.00) to be paid directly to the scholar for every month that he/she is in actual attendance during the first and second semester of the school year;
- ❑ Book allowance in the amount of Two Thousand Pesos (P2,000.00) per semester to pay for the books, school supplies and materials needed to be paid direct to the scholar;
- ❑ Transportation Allowance of Five Hundred Pesos (P500.00) per month;
- ❑ Lodging Allowance of Five Hundred Pesos (P500.00) per month;
- ❑ Graduation fee not exceeding Five Thousand Pesos (P5,000.00);
- ❑ Thesis Allowance of Ten Thousand Pesos (P10,000.00), if applicable; and;
- ❑ Summer Allowance of Five Thousand Pesos, if applicable in the curriculum (P 5,000.00)
